WIENER LABORATORY RESEARCH FELLOWSHIPS 2012-2013

Those Eligible: Scholars with a Ph.D. or graduate students working on a doctoral dissertation.

Fields of study: Well-defined projects from archaeological contexts in Greece; applicant working either alone or in collaboration with local research institutions in the following areas: environmental studies (archaeobotanical studies; study of seeds, charcoal, phytoliths, pollen, etc.); faunal remains; geological studies to address significant archaeological questions which may include quarried stone, lithics, building materials, ceramics, soil, and sediment studies or environmental studies. In addition, studies of human skeletal remains are supported by the J. Lawrence Angel Fellowship.

Other Duties: To contribute to the development of the Lab; to assist with queries from excavators; to offer a lecture on his/her project; to participate in one Regular Program School trip; and to contribute to seminars on aspects of archaeological science as part of the School's annual curriculum.

Duration: Academic year, beginning in September. Projects must be carefully planned for completion during this time.

Terms: Stipend from \$15,500 to \$27,000, depending on seniority and experience. School fees will be deducted from the fellowship stipend. Fellowship does not include travel costs, housing, board, and other living expenses.

Application:

1. Cover letter naming the applicant and title of the project.
2. Project description. In no more than 2,500 words, describe the purpose, nature and methodology of the research project you are proposing. Include the following information:
 - (a) aim, scope and significance of the project
 - (b) timetable, including publication schedule
 - (c) methodology to be used
 - (d) equipment/resources needed while at the Wiener Laboratory
 - (e) how the project relates to existing and current research on the topic
 - (f) bibliography of works relevant to the project
 - (g) transcripts or list of relevant course work.
3. Copies of permits(s) or letters from relevant authorities to study proposed materials, and copies of permission(s) from relevant excavation or project directors to study the proposed materials.
4. Budget. Itemize in as much detail as possible.

5. *Curriculum vitae*.

6. Two letters of recommendation.

Please note that in the past, proposals have been declined because the proposal either lacked sufficient scientific rationale, or the required letters of recommendation were never received. Preference will be given to projects that make significant use of the facilities of the Wiener Laboratory. Priority will also be given to applicants who have not received significant support from the Wiener Laboratory in the past three years.

A final report is due at the end of the award period, and the School expects that copies of all publications that result from research conducted as a Fellow of the ASCSA be contributed to the Wiener Laboratory library of the School.
