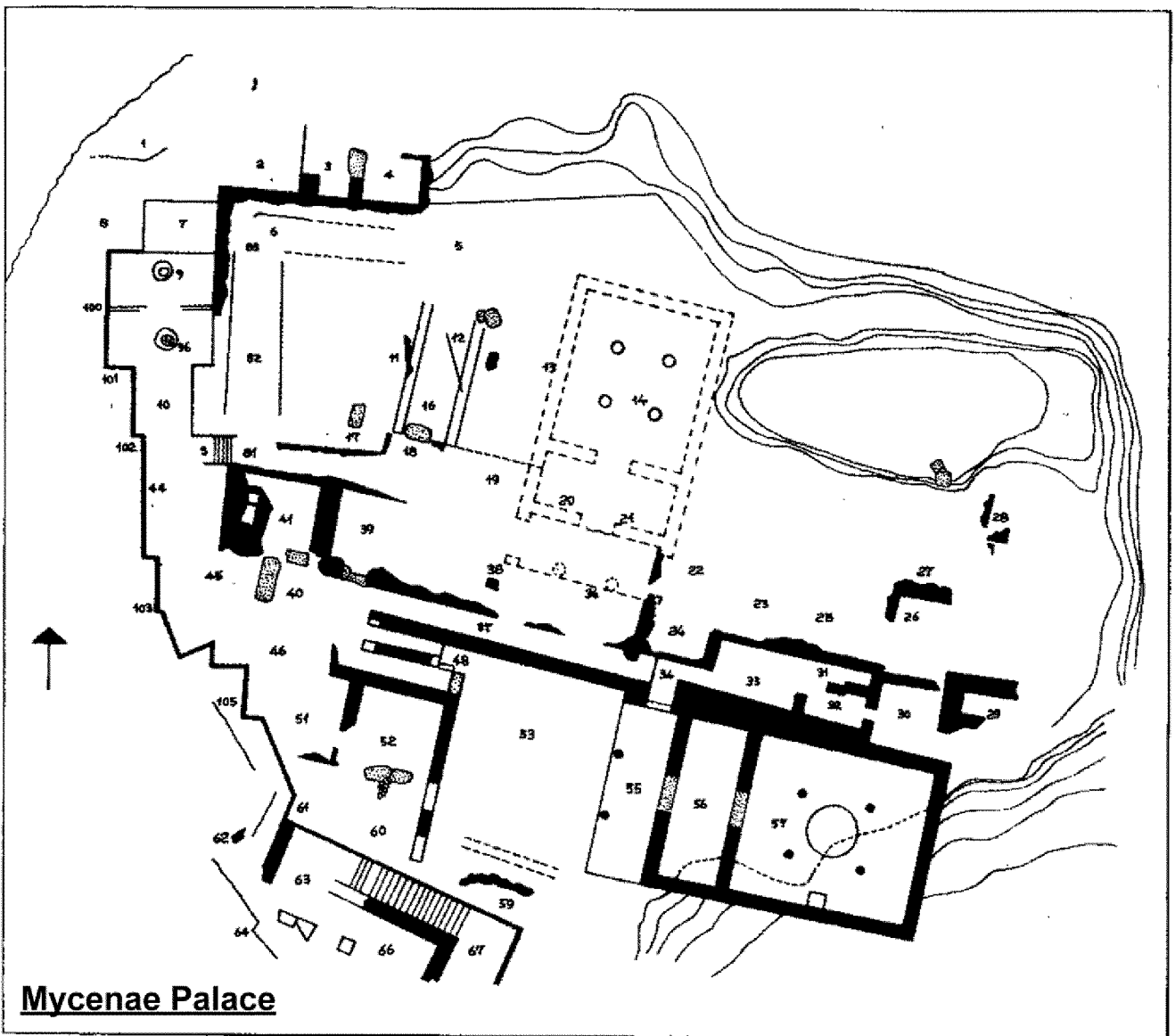

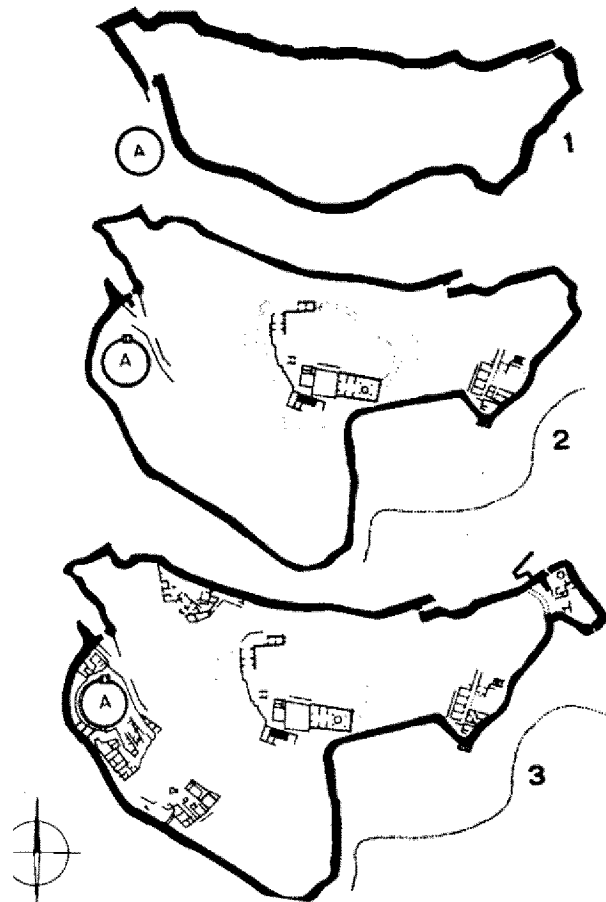

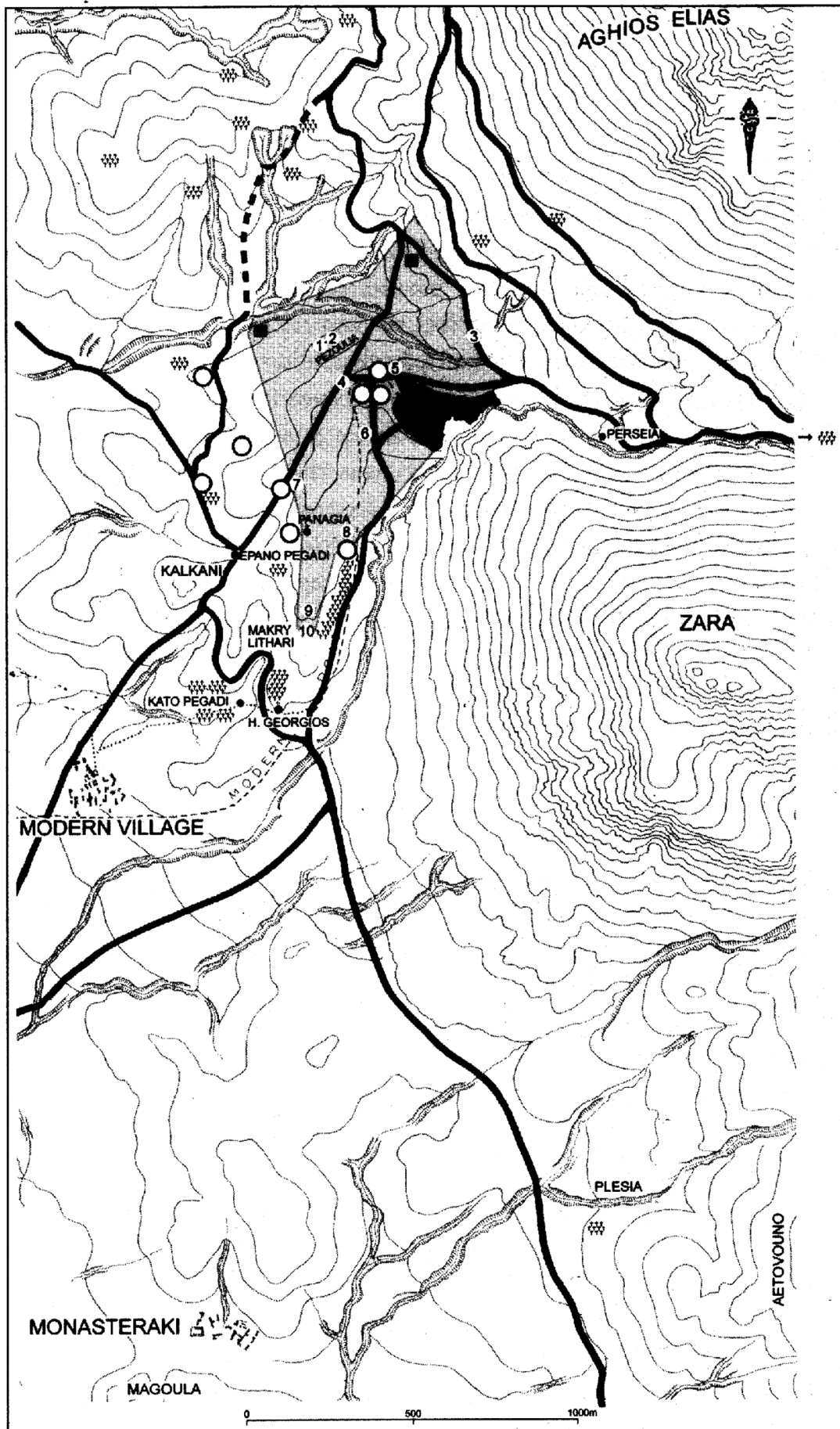

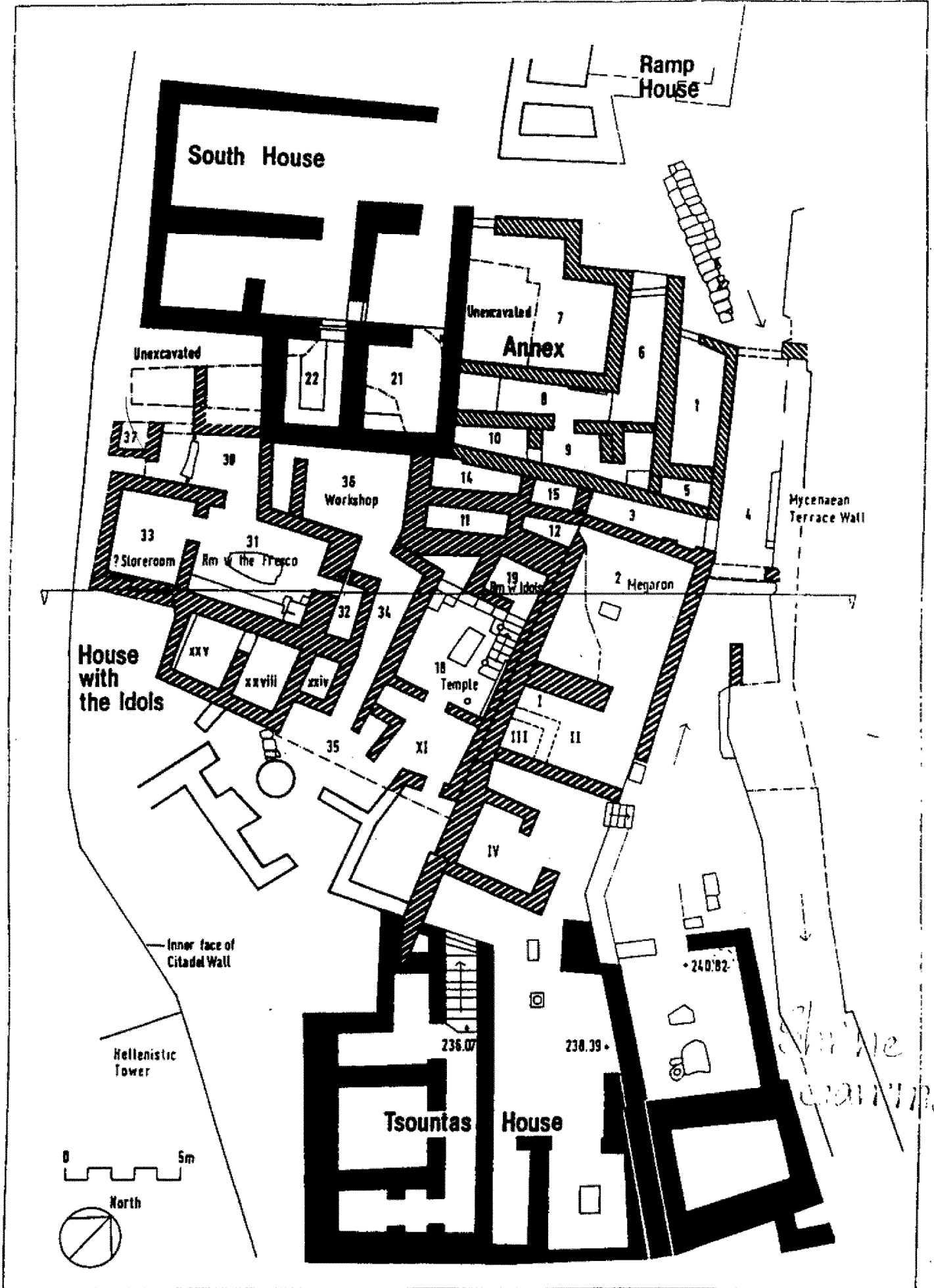

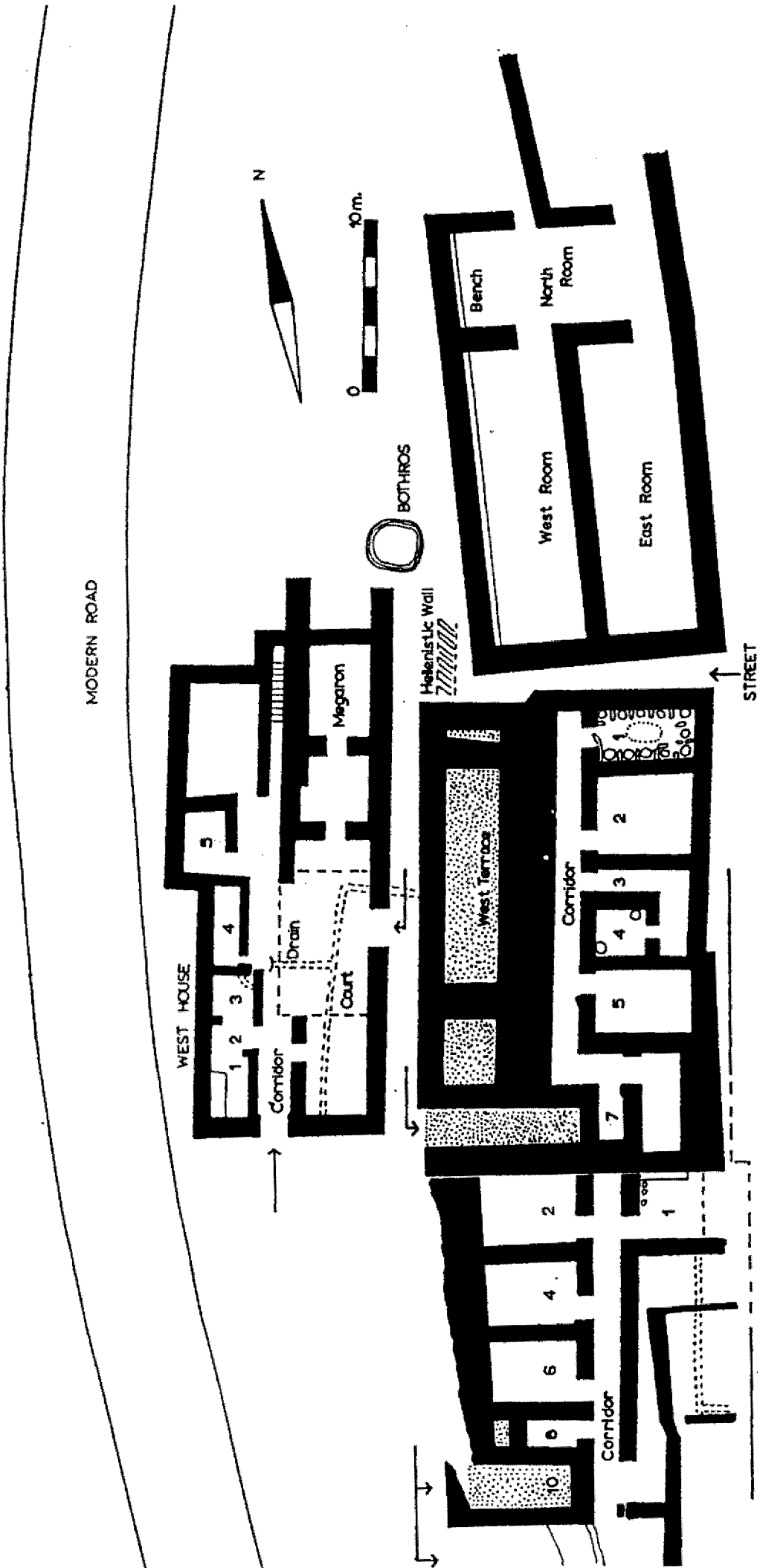

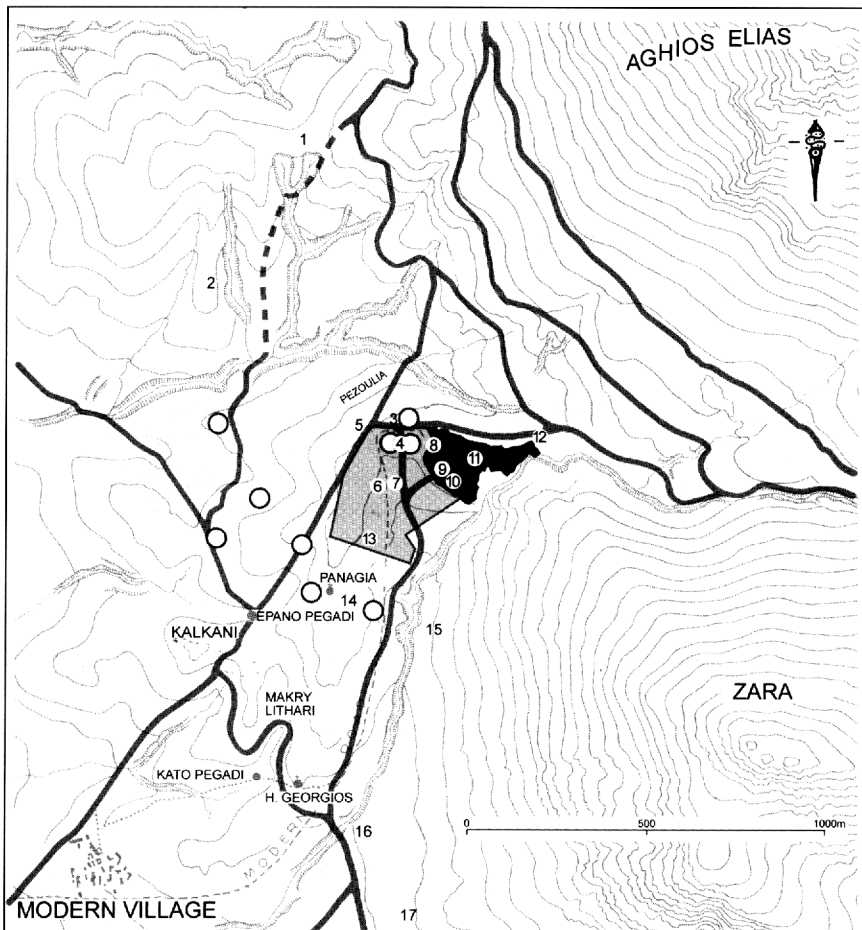
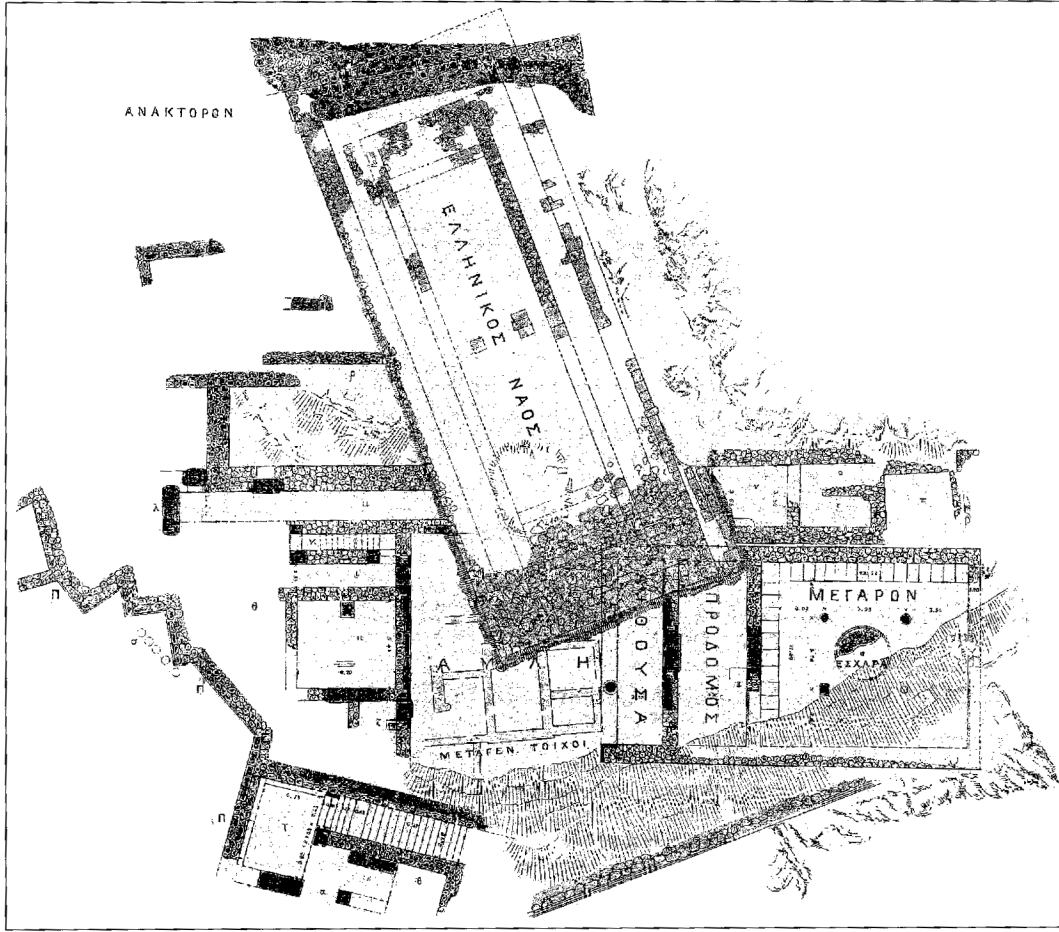

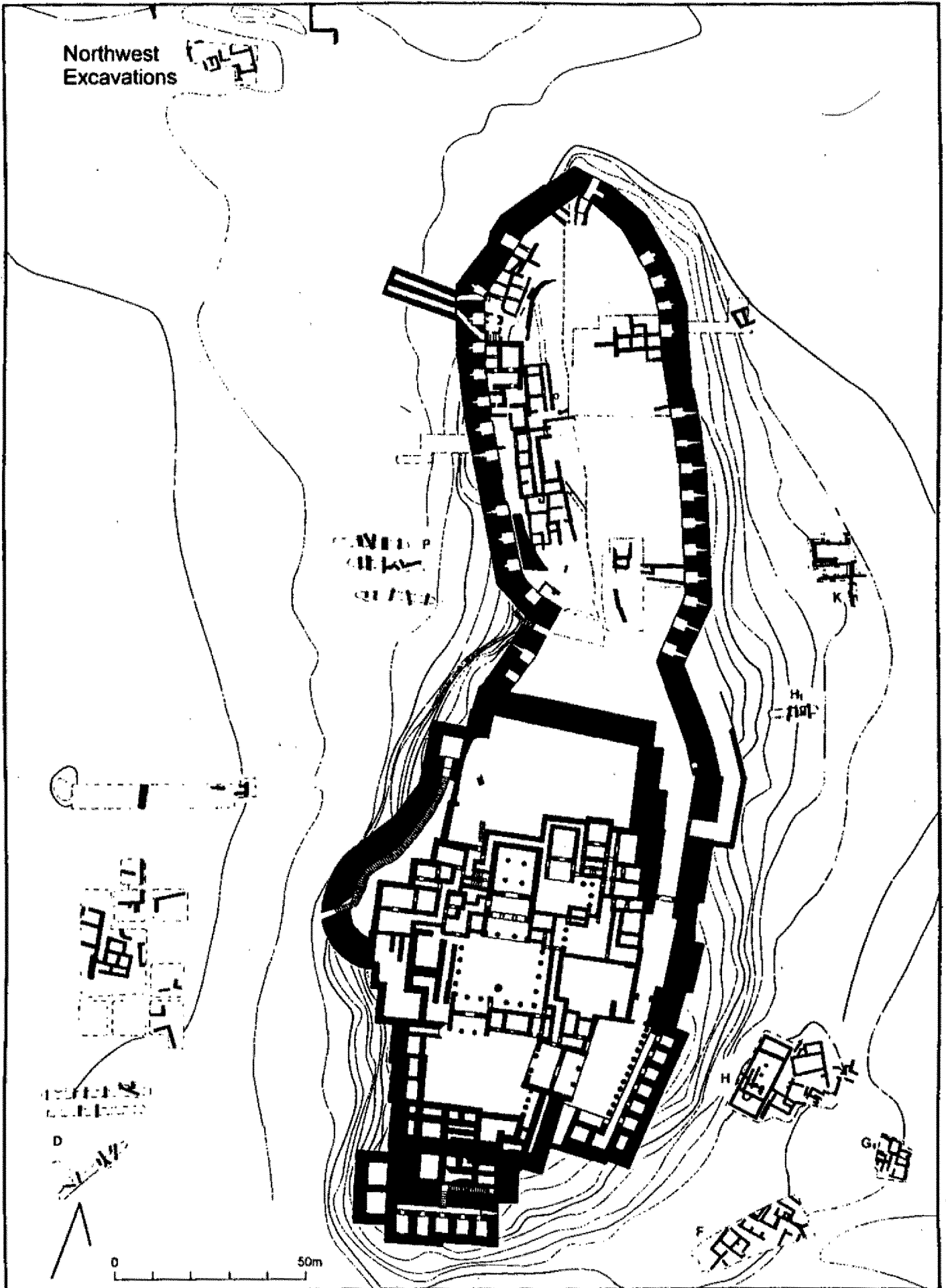
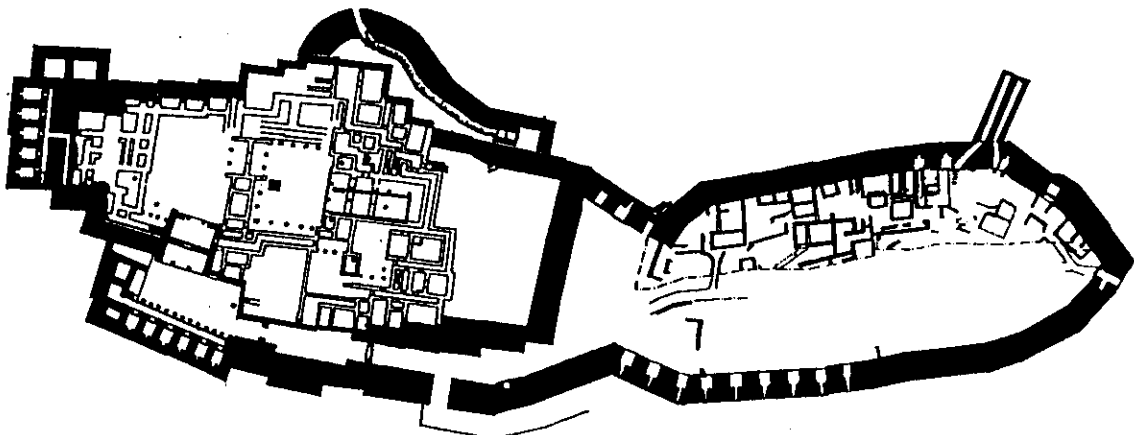
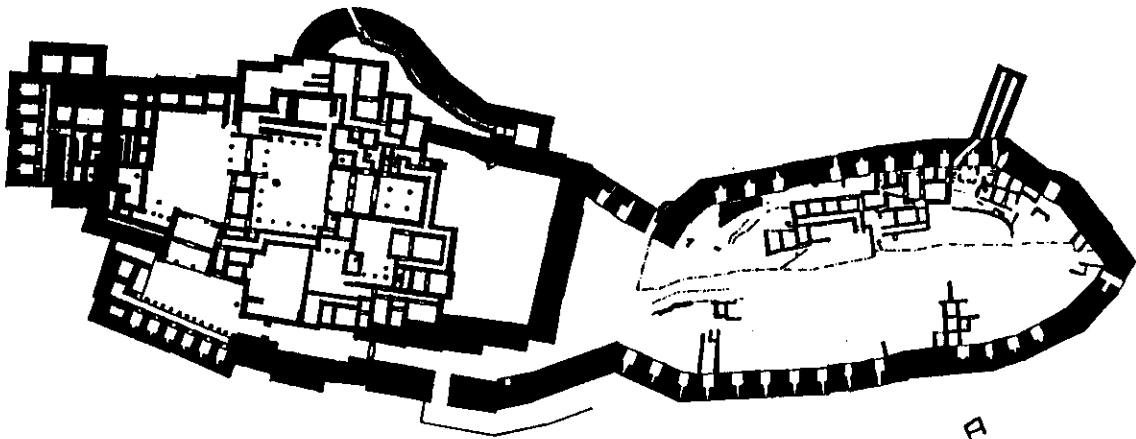
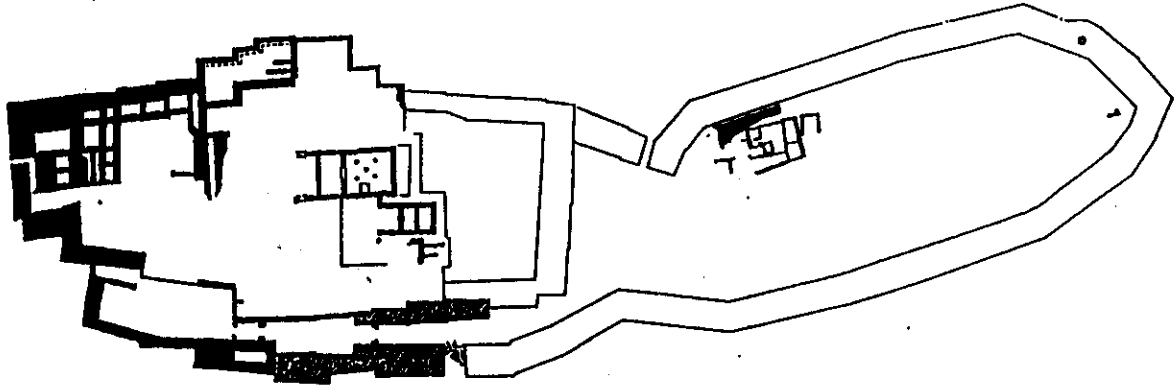
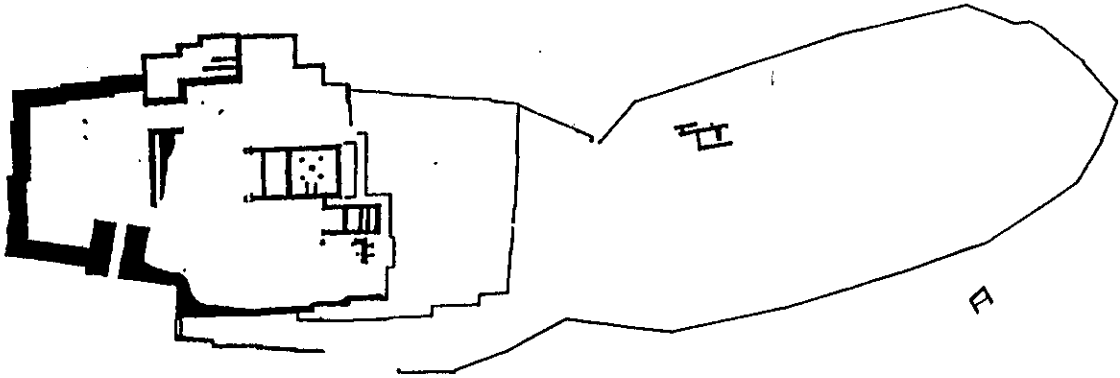
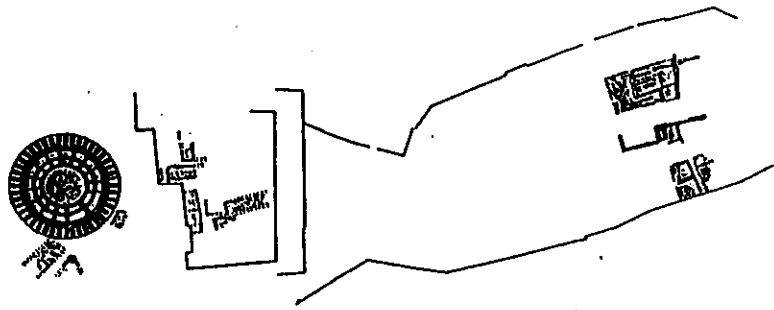
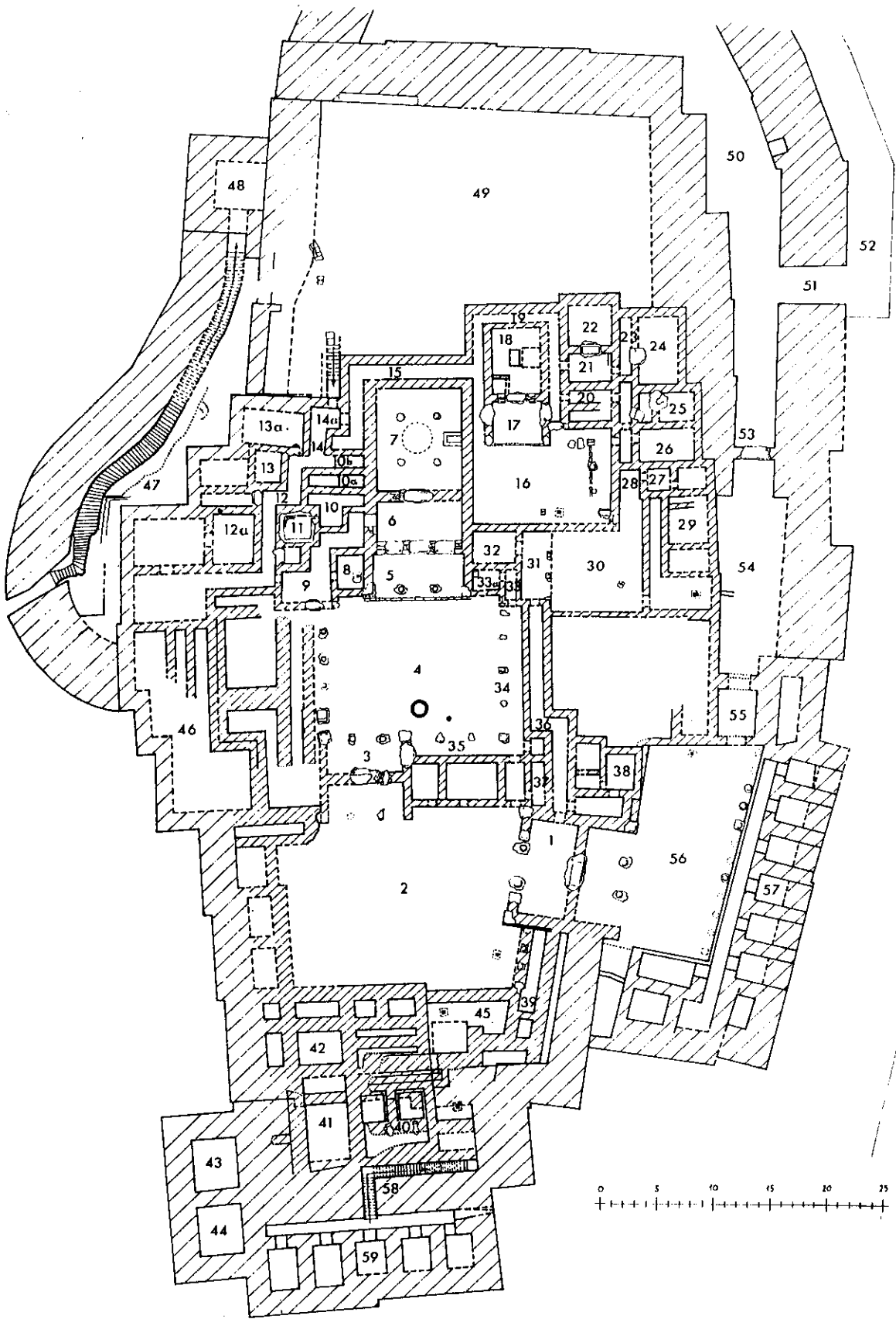
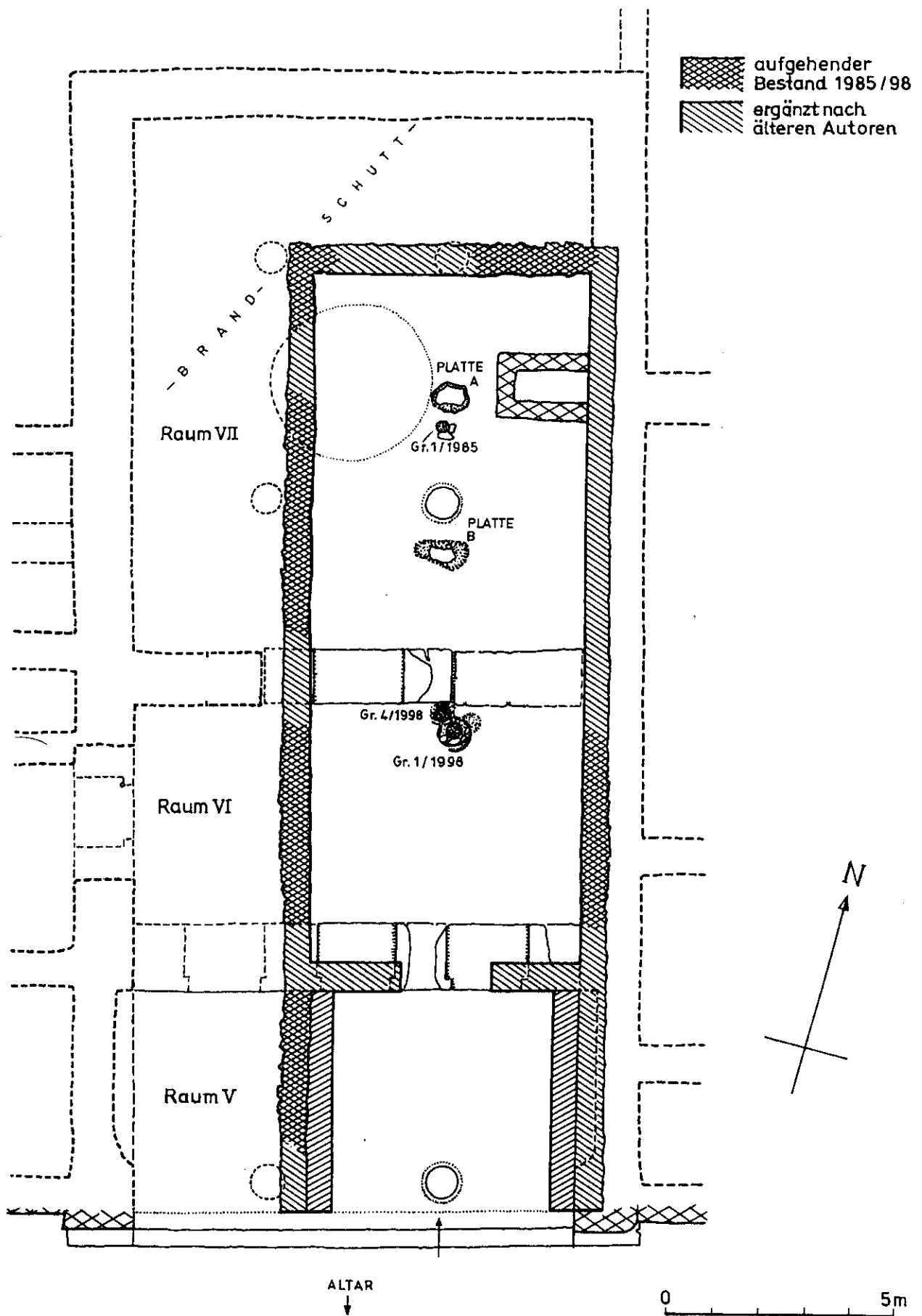


Fig. 4.4 Tiryns Citadel area (after Rieger and Böser 1990: plan 4).







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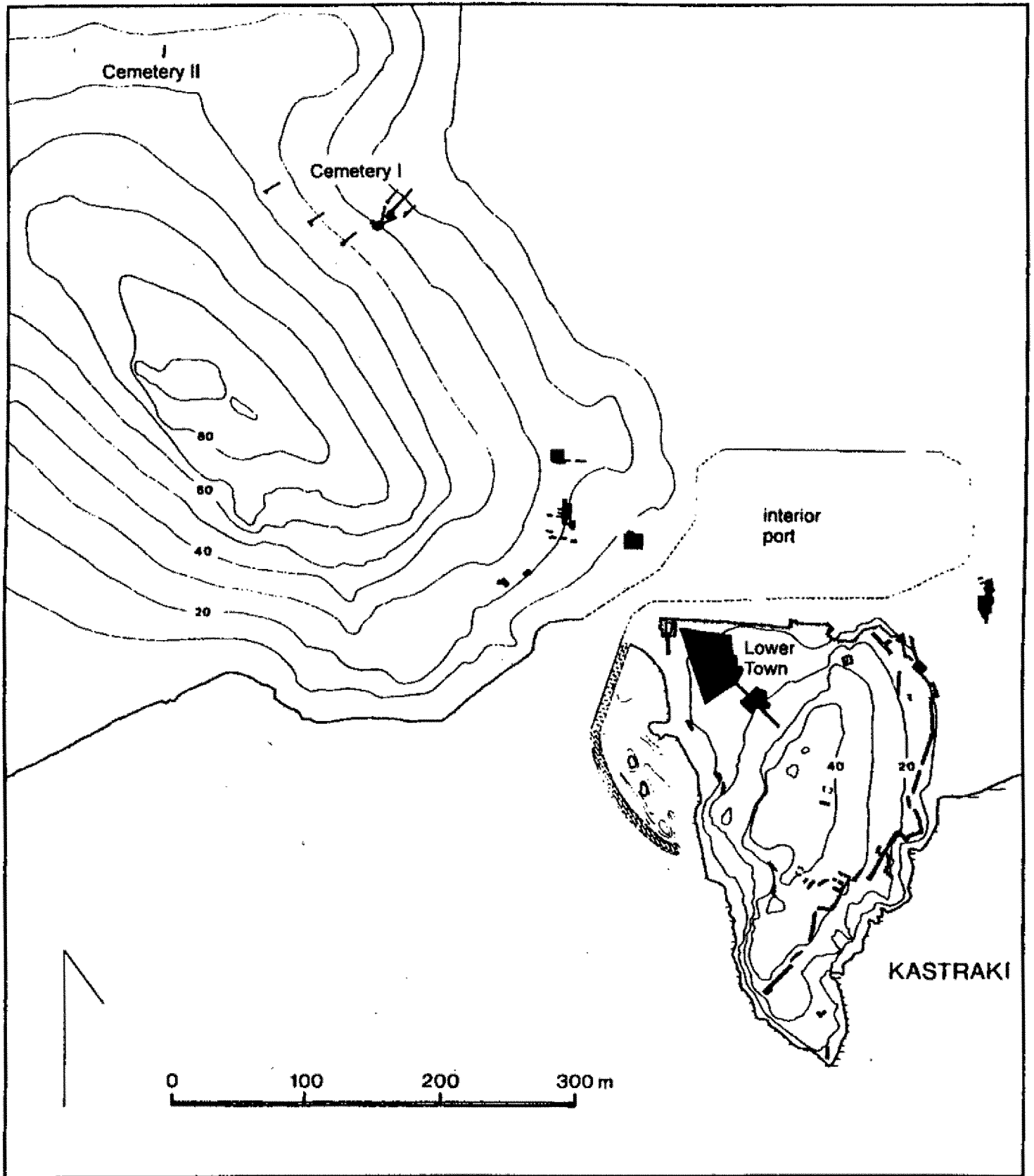


Fig 3.8 Excavated areas at the site of Asine, with restoration of the interior harbor (after Zangger 19994a: fig. 15).

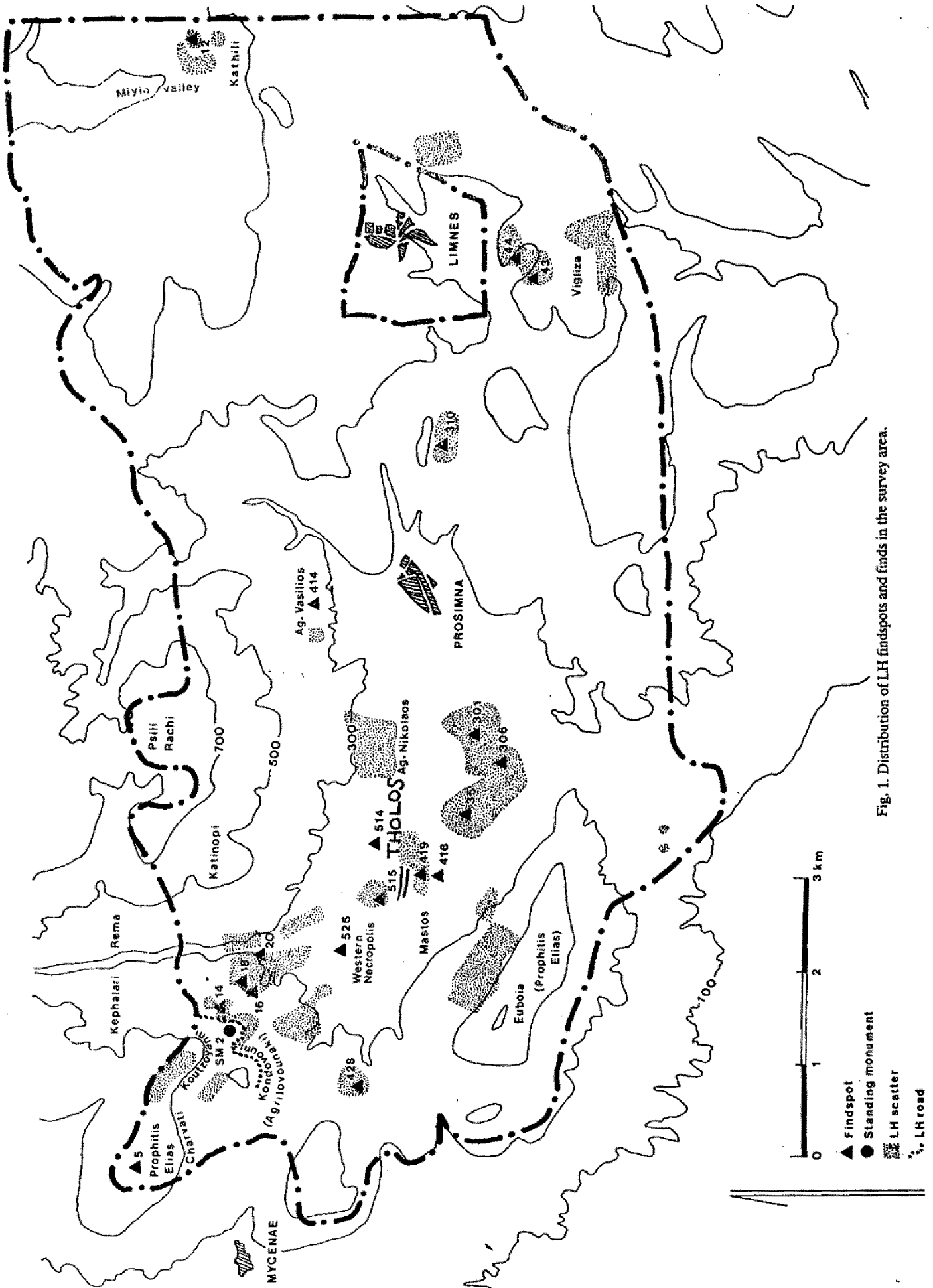
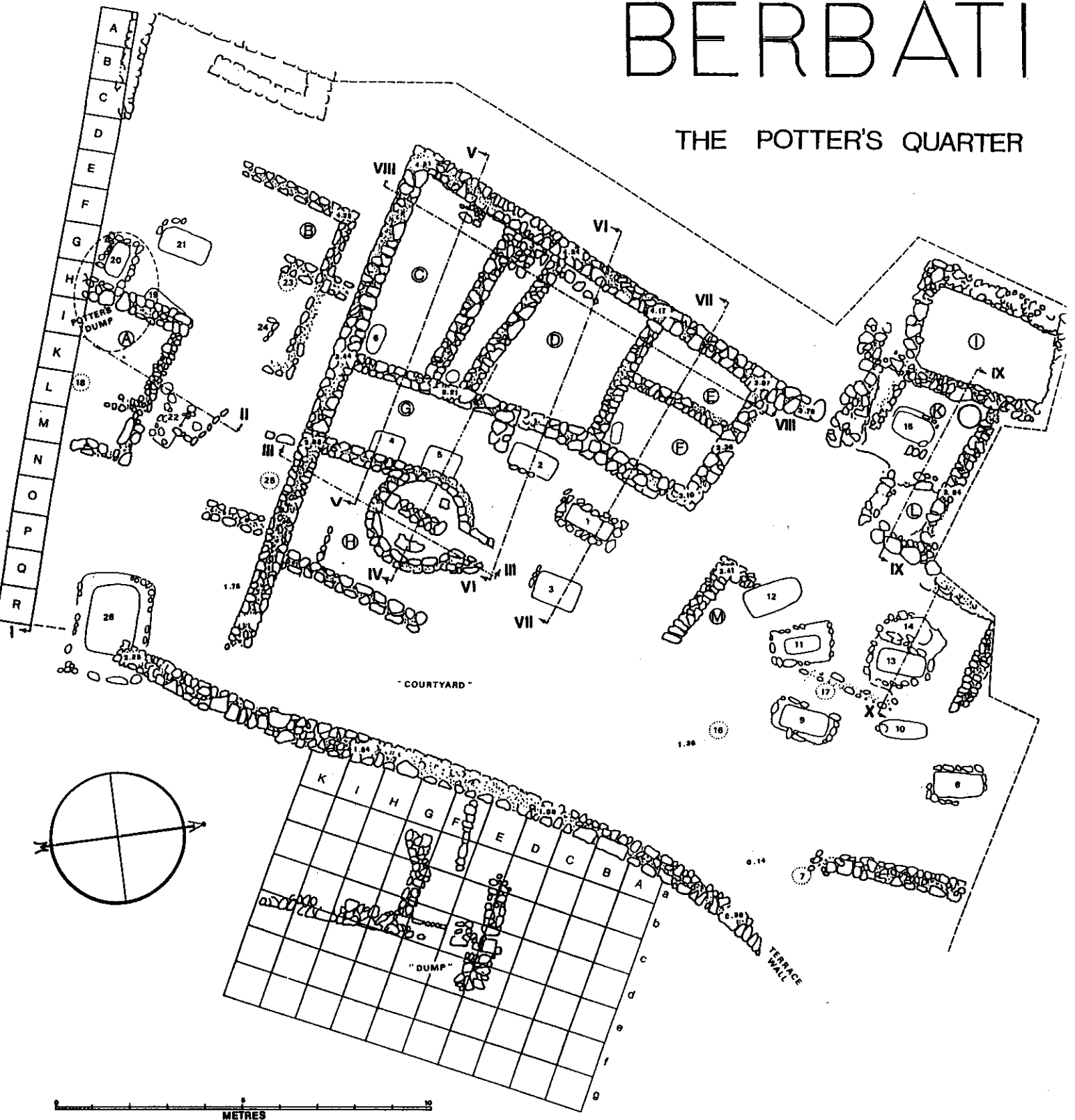


Fig. 1. Distribution of LH findspots and finds in the survey area.

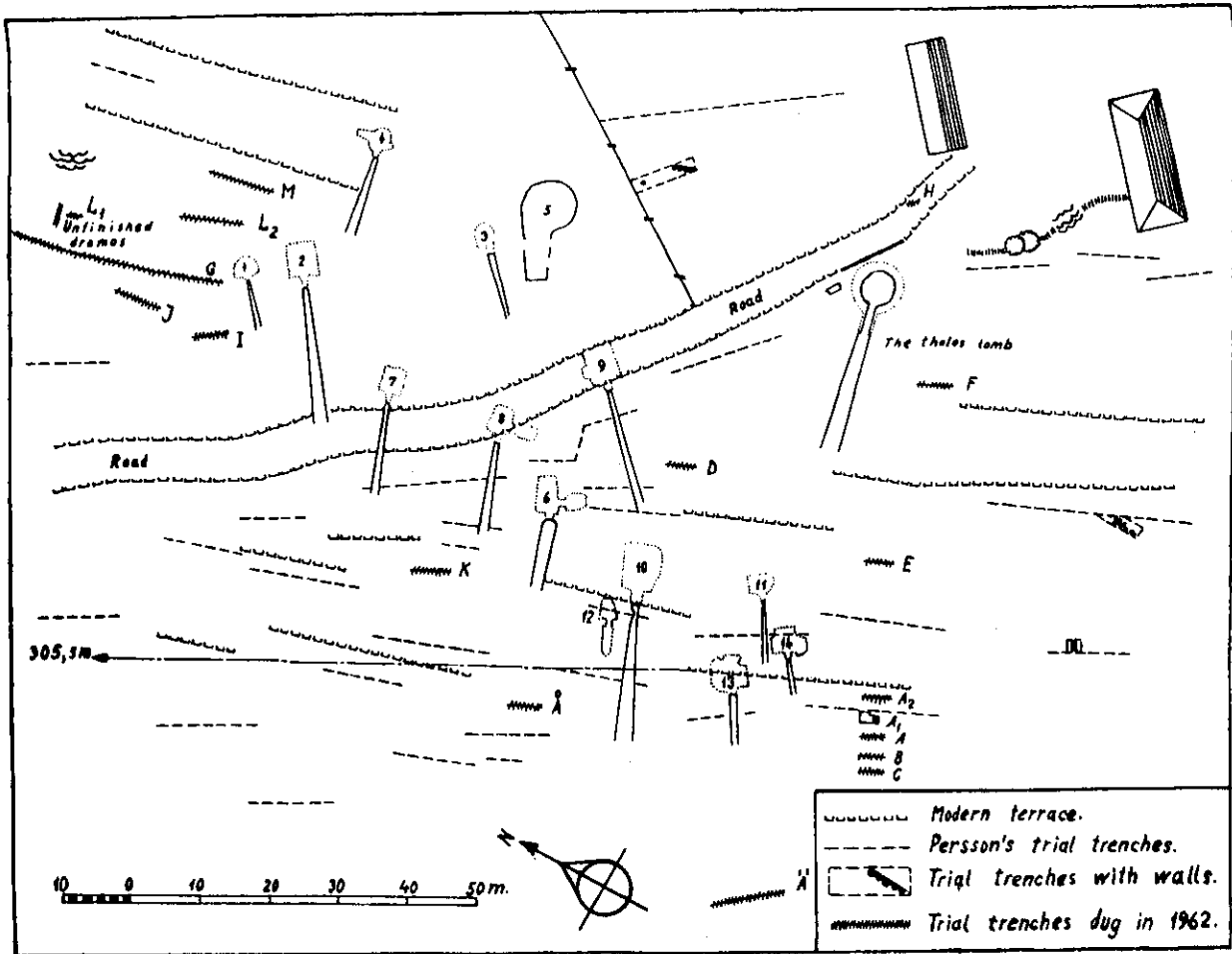


Fig. 3. Plan of the Dendra necropolis after the excavations of 1962. (After Åström et al., fig. 1.)

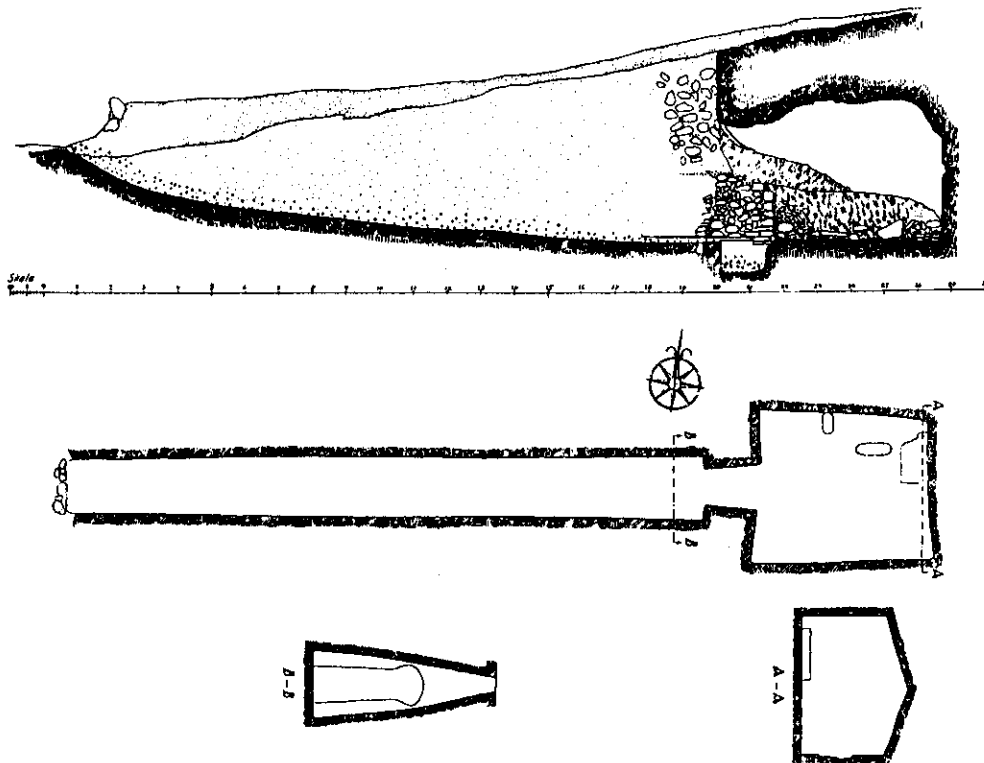


Fig. 4. Dendra tomb 2. (After Persson, *Royal tombs*, fig. 65.)

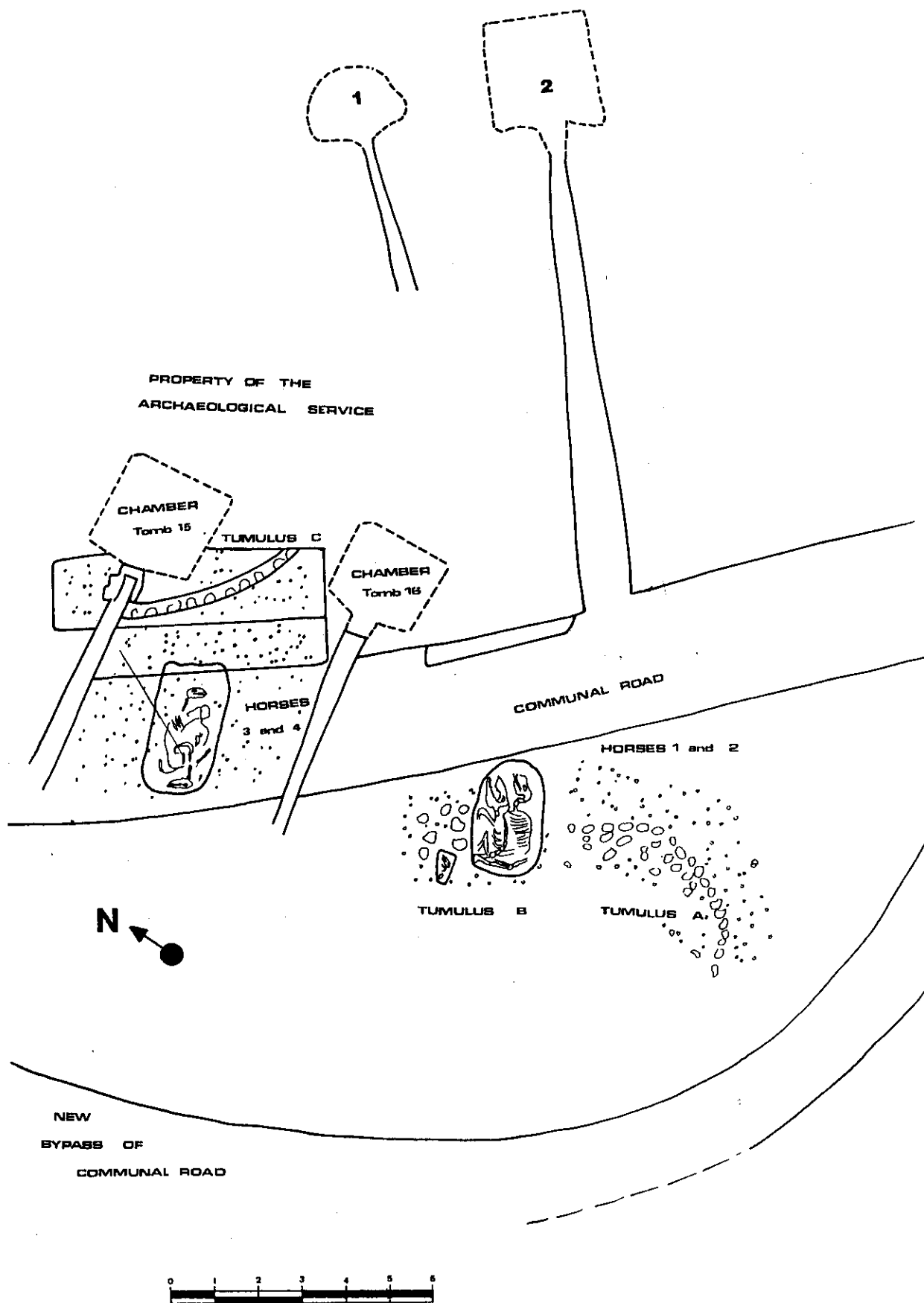






Fig. 4. Dendra, general plan of the area of the tumuli.
