## THE GENNADIUS LIBRARY ANNOUNCES

### THE COTSEN TRAVELING FELLOWSHIP FOR RESEARCH IN GREECE 2010-2011

The Gennadius Library offers the Cotsen Traveling Fellowship, a short-term grant awarded once a year for scholars and graduate students pursuing research topics that require the use of the Gennadeion collections.

The grant was established by the Gennadius Library's Board of Trustees to honor Lloyd E. Cotsen, Chair of the Board and gracious benefactor to the Library.

**Those eligible:** Senior scholars and graduate students.

**Terms:** Grant of \$2,000. School fees are to be paid out of the grant by the recipient. Fellowship does not include costs for School trips, housing or board. Requires residency in Athens of at least one month during the academic year from September 1, 2010 to June 1, 2011. The recipient is expected to take part in the activities of the Library and of the School in addition to pursuing research. A final report is due at the end of the award period, and the ASCSA expects that copies of all publications that result from research conducted as a Fellow of the ASCSA be contributed to the Gennadius Library of the School.

**Application:** The application should include a *curriculum vitae*, a letter (up to three pages) describing the project, proposed dates, budget, and explanation of the relation of the Gennadius Library's collection to the research project, and two letters of recommendation to [mgeorgopoulou@ascsa.edu.gr](mailto:mgeorgopoulou@ascsa.edu.gr).
