MELLON RESEARCH FELLOWSHIPS 2009-2010

***Final Year for three Fellowships for Scholars from
Bulgaria, the Czech Republic, Estonia, Hungary,
Latvia, Lithuania, Poland, Romania, and Slovakia***

- Field of Study:** Any field of classical studies, e.g., archaeology, art, history, epigraphy, or philology, or post-classical studies, e.g., Byzantine, post-Byzantine.
- Those Eligible:** Scholars with the Ph.D. or equivalent. Past recipients are not eligible for a second Fellowship, except under special circumstances and at least three years after last holding a Mellon Research Fellowship.
- Purpose:** To encourage scholars who have had little or no opportunity to study in the West. Mellon Research Fellowships are funded by the Andrew W. Mellon Foundation through a grant to the Council of American Overseas Research Centers. This is the final year of funding for this program.
- Duration:** Three months each. Time periods are September 15 - December 15; January 15 - April 15, and April 15 - July 15.
- Terms:** Cash stipend per Fellowship of \$11,500 and waiver of School fees. A final report is due at the end of the award period, and the ASCSA expects that copies of all publications that result from research conducted as a Fellow of the ASCSA be contributed to the relevant library of the School.
- Application:** Submit application, *curriculum vitae*, statement of the project (up to three pages in length) stating the importance of the research and the necessity for conducting it at the American School, two letters of reference from scholars in the field commenting on the value and feasibility of the project online on the ASCSA web site at www.ascsa.edu.gr.

Applications will be read by the academic staff of the American School, with particular weight being given to the project statement.

DEADLINE: JANUARY 15, 2009.

The awards will be announced March 15, 2009.
