seen this report and
surely a copy should have
been sent out in the
first instance, especially
if as surmised it
should be so important
to the administration of
the Company's affairs.
I write to ask your Excellency
kindly to inform me whether
any telegraphic information
is correct, and in that

indeed a strange return
for the part I have taken
not only in public life, but
also while connected with
the Railway of His Imperial
Majesty the Sultan, that
a proceeding of so
unusual a character
should be adopted by
some Member of the
Imperial Government
towards the Council
of which I have the honor
to be President.
